Christmas Pageant Costume Suggestions
Please, remember to keep it Simple!

<p><u>Kindergarten</u> Lambs: White pajamas or sweat pants and white t-shirt w/cotton balls glued on</p> <p>Students will be making a Lamb face in class</p>	<p><u>First Grade</u> Angels: Use a white pillowcase with neck and armholes cut out or white fabric Tie a cord around waist Halos: Gold garland wrapped around head Wings: made from cardboard painted white or simple costume white wings</p>	<p><u>Second Grade</u> Animals: Be creative – sheep, cattle, goats, etc. Keep it simple. Students will be making an animal mask in class</p>
<p><u>Third Grade</u> Stars: Student should wear Solid Dark clothing.</p> <p>Students will be making a Star “face” in class.</p>	<p><u>Fourth Grade</u> Shepherds: Use a beach towel draped over the shoulder and tied with a cord at the waist. Or, use a bathrobe. Or swag a rectangle of fabric or a scarf across the chest. Use a terry towel, a rectangle of leftover fabric, or a scarf tied with rope or cord around the head. Thongs or sandals for shoes.</p>	<p><u>Fifth Grade</u> Carolers: Scarves, mittens, and Christmas sweaters or red and green clothing.</p>
<p><u>Sixth Grade</u> Shepherds: Use a beach towel draped over the shoulder and tied with a cord at the waist. Or, use a bathrobe. Or swag a rectangle of fabric or a scarf across the chest. Use a terry towel, a rectangle of leftover fabric, or a scarf tied with rope or cord around the head. Thongs or sandals for shoes.</p>	<p><u>Seventh Grade</u> Kings: Use rich colored pillowcase, covered by a cape draped over the shoulder. If you don’t have a cape, get a big rectangle of leftover fabric and drape it over the shoulders and either tie it at the neck, Velcro it, or use a safety pin. Use any crowns you may have</p>	<p><u>Eight Grade</u> Townspeople of Bethlehem Use a beach towel draped over the shoulder and tied with a cord at the waist. Or, use a bathrobe. Or swag a rectangle of fabric or a scarf across the chest. Use a terry towel, a rectangle of leftover fabric, or a scarf tied with rope or cord around the head. Thongs or sandals for shoes.</p>

Remember to keep this relaxed and simple. We hope this special event will encourage children to imagine, remember and rejoice at what happened in Bethlehem over 2000 years ago.
